INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF ABSTRACTS

All Abstracts must be prepared in British standard grammatical English and should be typed in single-line spacing throughout, using standard-sized (A4) paper.

Authors will be held responsible for the abstract content and for compliance with these Instructions.

Please arrange the abstract as follows:

- **Title of the abstract** in low case and boldface type.
- After a line of space, names of the authors (first names before surnames, no academic titles)
- Starting on the next line and after a line of space the **authors' affiliations** (as brief as possible): Department, Clinic or Institute (City, Country).

Sharon Low, Andrew Seow

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- After a line of space, the text of the abstract without indentation. MAXIMUM ABSTRACT LENGTH:
 400 words. Inclusion of Tables or Figures is not allowed.
- If needed please organize the abstract according to the following sections: OBJECTIVE, MATERIAL AND METHODS, RESULTS, DISCUSSION, CONCLUSIONS. Each section should start on a new line and section headings should appear in upper case and plain type.
 - Statements as 'Results will be discussed", "Data will be presented" will not be accepted.
- References must appear in a numbered list (<u>maximum 3 references</u>, <u>numbered according to the order</u> of appearance in the text); references must be cited in the text using numbers in square brackets.

Example of a journal article citation:

Journal titles should be abbreviated according to Index Medicus
